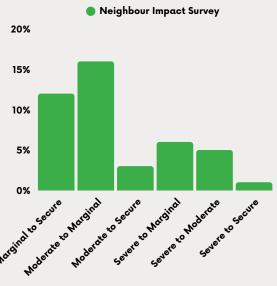


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement **Food for Life Halton Programs** October 2024

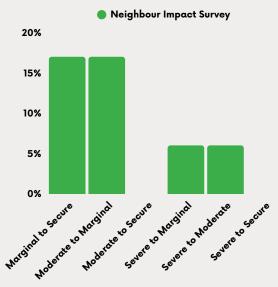


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement Food for Life Acton Programs October 2024

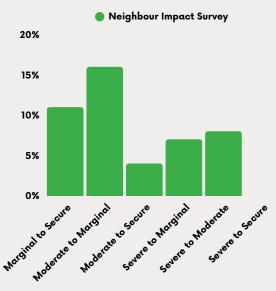


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement Food for Life Burlington Programs October 2024

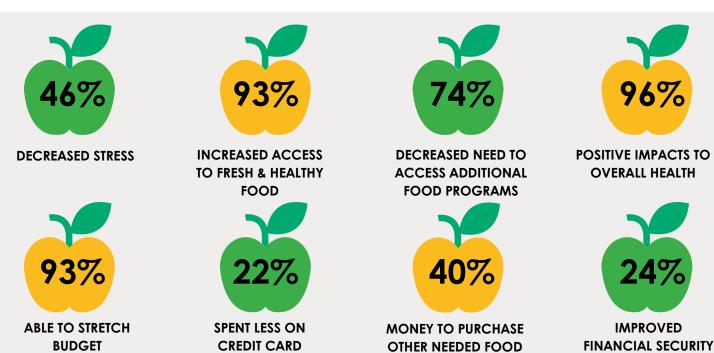

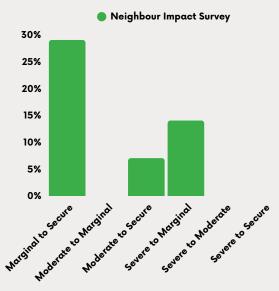


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement **Food for Life Georgetown Programs** October 2024

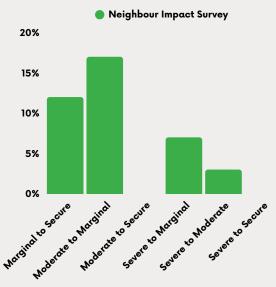


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement Food for Life Milton Programs October 2024

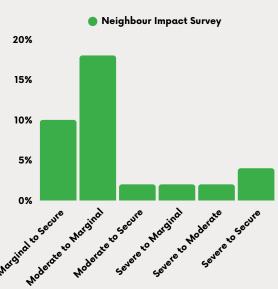


Fig. 1: Level of Food Security Improvement Food for Life Oakville Programs October 2024
